

Various studies have revealed:

How Important the Arts are to STEM Education



STEM might be necessary for technological progress, but without the arts, it may not be possible for children to derive the most out of their education. The numbers already paint an emerging picture.



Students who study the arts are four times more likely to be recognized for academic achievement



On average, students who study the arts for four years in high school score 98 points higher on the SATs compared to those who study for half a year or less



Students who took up music appreciation scored 61 points higher on the verbal section and 42 points higher on the math section



Students who study the arts are also three times more likely to receive awards for school attendance.



Additionally, one study noted that STEM graduates who successfully opened their own businesses or filed for patents were eight times more likely to be exposed to the arts as children than the average person.
